

X PROPOSED SYMPOSIUM, AN INVITATION

In the Correspondence section of this issue is a letter from Dr. Felix Sagher, of Jerusalem, asking for opinions about (1) the significance of hypopigmented patches in bacteriologically negative contact children, and (2) contacts without visible lesions but positive smears from the skin or nasal mucous membrane, or both. He suggests a symposium by correspondence on the subject.

Copies of his letter are being sent to certain leprologists who are known to have had experience that would bear on the questions. Those known persons, however, are certainly a minority of those who could, if they would, make valuable contributions to the discussion.
