American Leprosy Missions, Inc., has made a grant of \$1,500 to the INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF LEPROSY for the 1966-1967 fiscal year of the Mission to enable THE JOURNAL to print an increased number of pages, expanding publication of original articles and current literature in THE JOURNAL's newly adopted format. In transmitting notice of the decision of ALM,
