

INQUIRIES FOR REPLY

In the correspondence section of this issue of THE JOURNAL is an inquiry from Dr. J. N. Rodriguez, concerning the occurrence and nature of cases that present macules which show only round-cell infiltration on histological examination.

Heretofore when such an inquiry has been received it has been forwarded to persons known to the Editor to be interested in the question raised, and it has been withheld from publication until replies have been received. This procedure has insured attention to the question by at least those addressed, but at the same time it has limited the scope of the discussion for the reason that few others have volunteered contributions to it, though many others were undoubtedly in a position to do so.

It is believed to be preferable, hereafter, to publish all such inquiries as soon as they are received, with open invitations for comments. It is hoped in this way to arrive at symposia that will be useful either in clearing up doubtful points or in calling attention to questions that need investigation. That invitation is extended to all readers of THE JOURNAL in the present case.
