
THE CAIRO CONFERENCE

Announcements of the leprosy conference to be held in Cairo in March, 1938, were published in the last issue of **THE JOURNAL**. In both of the two articles on the subject the meeting was referred to as the first Congress of the International Leprosy Association, and in one of them the origin of the plan was recounted. Too late to change the announcements, we were informed by the General Secretary-Treasurer of the Association that it had been decided, by majority (postal) vote of the General Council, that the conference should not be a congress of the Association but the Fourth International Leprosy Conference, in continuation of those that were held in Berlin in 1897, in Bergen in 1909, and in Strasbourg in 1923.
