EDUARDO RABELLO

Professor Eduardo Rabello, M.D., died of uremia on August 8, 1940. Born in Barra Mansa, State of Rio de Janeiro, on September 22, 1876, he obtained his medical degree from the Faculty of Rio de Janeiro in 1902. In 1915 he became associate professor of dermatology and in 1925 was appointed to the chair of that department. He was a member of various national and foreign medical associations, and a Knight of the Legion of Honor of France.

Long interested in the subject of leprosy, Professor Rabello was active in the establishment of the International Center of Leprology and was made director of it after the death of Professor Chagas. His capability as an administrator is reflected in the work done in that center, much of it in his clinic building. He was one of those who were instrumental in the establishment on its present basis of the *Revista Brasileira de Leprologia*, originally the *Revista de Leprologia de São Paulo*. A more adequate review of his activities and accomplishments appears in the September, 1940, number of that periodical. On September 11th the Brazilian Society of Dermatology held a meeting in his memory, during which various speakers eulogized him as a teacher, clinician and leprologist, as well as friend.
